## 1.Presidents Welcome

Alan Watt thanked everybody for coming in particular our new member Craig Kyle he then went on to thank the committee and Members for their help and support during his recent loss.

## 2. Minutes of 2022 AGM

Minutes of the 2022 AGM were Previously circulated for comment and it was noted that the actions from the minutes had been attended to they were duly proposed and seconded by Paul Mosley and Jim Marshall. There was only one action from the 2022 AGM which was a change to the bank Signatories which has been done.

## 3. Treasurer's Report.

The Closing Balance after all transactions was  $\pounds 2.75$  less the Opening balance leaving a healthy amount of  $\pounds 2,276.75$ . The 1<sup>st</sup> payment of  $\pounds 200$  worked well and allowed us to have funds in the account to pay the ice in advance as per Active Stirling Terms and Conditions the 2 meals we had were added to the individuals accounts which worked well. The accounts are currently being examined.

On assuming office this season, the first task was to update signatories, obtain debit cards and access online banking. This proved very problematic, time consuming and extremely frustrating. However, my experience was not isolated and other Clubs had similar issues with other banks. For the treasurer's trouble, the Bank of Scotland paid the club £100 compensation and £14 expenses.

Once the financial access was granted, the season's financial transactions were much easier and the ICE pay in advance system with the Peak worked well. The opening balance was extremely like the closing balance and the financial position is the club has £2276.75 free funds (£2.75 less than 21-22

The 1 st payment of £200 worked well and allowed a certainty to have funds to cover the Ice and other payments in advance as we are now required to do so. The Christmas and closing Bonspiel meals were added to the individual's account and this worked well. I would like to hear any comments on this.

We maintained a charge of £10 for internal matches throughout the season despite the ice charges rising. I have not been advised of 23-24 charges but assume they will increase in Jan 24.

Club membership was £20 and RCCC £25 for the 22-23 Season (unchanged for next season).

The club accounts are currently being audited.
